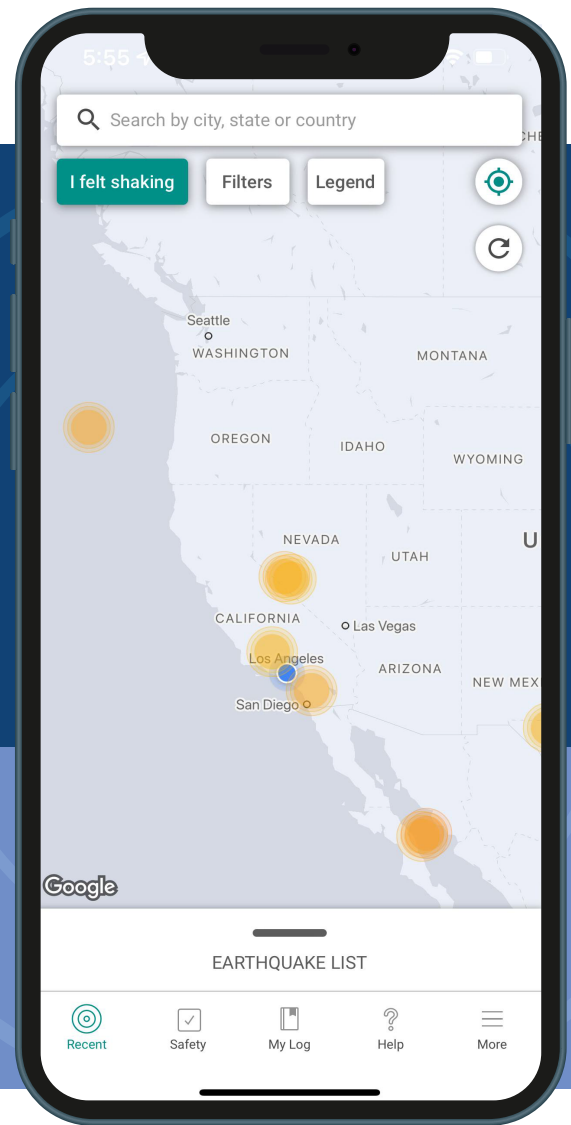
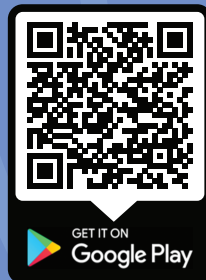
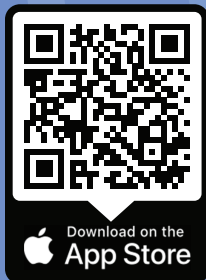


Earthquake Early Warning App

*Don't let earthquakes
catch you off guard*



The California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES), UC Berkeley, and the United States Geological Survey launched the nation's first statewide Earthquake Early Warning System in 2019.

Historically, underserved communities – particularly communities of color – are disproportionately impacted by earthquakes and other natural disasters. Resources like the MyShake phone app will aid in ensuring all communities across California have access readily to real-time earthquake alerts to provide seconds of life saving time to prepare.

Disasters can occur at any time, with little warning. However, MyShake is available to aid mitigate damages to our communities.

What is MyShake app?

The MyShake App is an earthquake warning tool developed by the UC Berkeley Seismology Lab and funded by Cal OES. MyShake detects significant earthquakes quickly so alerts can notify Californians to take protective action when seismic activity is occurring at their location.

MyShake provides reports submitted by other community members (in real-time) along with information from the USGS and other global earthquake authorities.

Download the official App from the Apple App and Google Play stores.

Select a default location for earthquake alerts. (Must have latest app update)

**Optional: Turn location services on.*

Reminder Tips for Earthquake Safety

Step 1: Secure your space by identifying hazards.

Step 2: Creating a disaster plan and deciding how you will communicate in an emergency.

Step 3: Organize disaster supplies and important documents.

Step 4: Drop, Cover and Hold On when the earth shakes.

Step 5: Evacuate if necessary, and help injured.
